Thought Force Topic: HOSPITALITY GUIDELINES FOR ASSEMBLY

Background/Historical Info: We have traditionally hosted a Hospitality Room at AWSC, Assembly and Convention. They are three very separate events, with very different Hospitality needs. Over time they have merged into a single approach to "hospitality" which has often included incredible stresses on Districts as well as on individuals. Costs have gotten very high in the purchase of food and paper goods, and sometimes the stuff gets passed along until there are a half dozen large boxes of paper goods and even foodstuffs that get hauled around and have to be stored. There seems to be a lot of confusion about who is responsible for what and how to coordinate the process.

Financial Impact: At the last Assembly the Area made a large unbudgeted contribution to Hospitality because the two districts were concerned with the level of eating, and the demands being placed on them by the membership.

Charge: Brainstorm ideas about Hospitality and look at this historical part of our Assembly to see if we can re-envision the best way to go forward. Looking at our Legacies, using the Service Manual, and relying on your own experiences ask these 5 questions and see if we can get some new ideas flowing. What is it? Do we need it? Do we want it? What do we want? Be creative. Don't try to solve the problem or come up with specific answers. Think and discuss and try out new perspectives.

- Is there a health code issue?
- Can we get a Storage unit?
- What is the cost of hotel provisions of Hospitality room? Food? Coffee?
- Wish I knew what past Hospitality Rooms worked and what didn't work.
- How about District provide some of the food, maybe a schedule of contributions like Convention?
- How about just fellowship? Keep it simple.
- How much storage space is needed? How much does it cost? Does the hotel have storage?
- What about every District providing \$25 toward Hospitality?
- Can we rename Hospitality to Fellowship?
- How much is needed? How much is left over? How much time is spent on this?
- I wish we knew estimated head counts. How many? How much? How to communicate to Hospitality to host Districts?
- We should lower expectations.
- Can we limit to non-cooked snacks? Or no food?
- It would be great to have an evaluation of the Hospitality experience.
- What about eliminating food? Just have coffee and water?
- What are the specific complaints in the past?
- How do groups understand and interpret Tradition 7?
- Create a spreadsheet to keep track of Hospitality information.
- Can we increase Assembly Registration?
- (1) It is unanimous that we want Hospitality at Assembly.
- (2) It is nearly unanimous that there are problems with how it is currently run
- (3) Chairperson will create a Task Force to create Temporary Guidelines to work with two Districts for May 2015 Assembly.
- (4) Evaluation after May 2015 Assembly between Districts and Task Force.
