District 13 was able to send five kids and two AMIAS to our Alateen Conference and the word from everyone is that it was AWESOME. We love our Public Outreach table set up and used it yet again for a church event last weekend. The pastor invited us to share what we are about and there was a very positive response from the church members. At the moment we do not have an official Public Outreach Chairperson but because we have individuals dedicated to public outreach we continue to disburse our Al-Anon CAL wherever we can and set up our table when we are invited or connect with a Health and Wellness fair. Most of our 2016 AFAs have been given away and we now have our new box of 2017 AFAs.

We are planning on hosting another of our famous "Tea and Card Party" events next year, probably in February. These feature Al-Anon member made greeting cards for all occasions at great prices. There is an amazing meeting occurring each week at a facility which serves teens aged 13-17 who are mandated to be in a recovery program. Since our member, B.B., started Al-Anon meetings here almost a year ago it has been a powerful and welcome experience for the kids, the staff and our members who donate their one hour each week. All of these kids are returning to either homes where there is active alcoholism/addiction or group homes where it is present. Since it is a locked facility, any Al-Anon member can participate.
