

2021 in Review. Like most Districts, 2021 was very challenging due to Covid. Our groups and members continue working hard on recovery, with many returning to in-person meetings. While not optimum, many members are finding the abundance of zoom meetings a real benefit, particularly when other fellowship options are limited. Our recovery horizons are expanded by participating in international zoom meetings.

1. **Meetings.** District 4 is now supporting 29 meetings, 15 meetings are in person only, 6 are hybrid and 8 are zoom only. In the past month we have added two new meetings.

4. **Public Outreach (PO).** Our formal PO efforts in the past quarter been greatly reduced due to the holidays and the Omicron Variant. We look forward to getting back to an active PO program soon.

5. **Communications**
 - (a) D4 Zoom Account. We continue to use the District 4 zoom account, allowing large meetings and workshops to be easily done.
 - (b) Web Site. Our web master, Rae D, continues to improve and add additional information to our web site.
 - (c) Reaching out to GR's. Through hard work by our group records person, Carol C, we now have re-established contacts at all active meetings.
6. **Alateen.** We have six AMAIS in District 4.
 - (a) The face-to-face Alateen meeting that restarted in Ormond Beach continues, we are looking to establish a second meeting in the north part of District 4.
