Madam Chair Diane,

Thank you for the opportunity to participate in this thought force. We have included each of our views of the 5 KBDM questions that you have provided, and we followed. Some of the answers were far apart.

In summary, based on the information we were given, 4 main issues came to light:

- 1) 25 of 60 surveyed preferred 2 assemblies
- Consideration of cost to individual groups
- 3) The fellowship associated with the gathering of Al Anon
- 4) Redundancy

The majority prefer 2 meetings to one. It would have been nicer to have more included in participating in the survey.

The cost to the individual groups is a necessary consideration. Some of the smaller groups have difficulty, thus are not always able to participate. This was a noted concern in positive response for one meeting.

So many appreciate, enjoy the fellowship of the gatherings. Working through lunches and dinner times tends to squelch this ability. These are great times to have "the meeting after the meeting" as we say, to chat about the information we have just received and are trying to process. Also working through meals and late, has a way of overloading us with information to the point we can no longer manage. It tends to cause circuit overload.

Redundancy was an issue brought up in many ways but ends up the same. We are given reports to read, then verbal reports. Oral reports in addition take a lot of time, & it comes fast thus difficult to take notes enough to reference, then the written becomes easier to refer to so should be all inclusive.

From this information, the recommendation is 2 assemblies, more digital reports without repetition in the oral presentations and lastly a close look at ways to decrease the overall cost of assemblies to the fellowship. The choice of a Task Force for more information could be a consideration by this panel or the next .
