We were doubly blessed this year with more than enough volunteers to fill all our time slots. Every year we learn something new. We are looking forward to applying our new knowledge to next year's event.

The City of Jacksonville has invited us to have a display at their Senior's Symposium in August. We have a volunteer lined up for that event and will let you know how it goes.

We continue to feel very successful in our Institutions meetings at Gateway and Lakeview. Our District has budgeted to provide literature for both Institutions. Gateway has around 35 attendees every other Wednesday and the Lakeview meetings are relatively smaller.
